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All students must apply for admission to the university and the Nursing major. Applicants for the Nursing major will be reviewed on factors such as cumulative college GPA, number of credit hours taken at Avila, on campus interview, and patterns and trends in academic history indicating potential for success. Students must complete the application process by the application deadline of January 10 of the year they will start nursing major coursework. Nursing applications become available in October. The application process is outlined on our webpage www.avila.edu/nursing/admission.asp. Late applications may be submitted March 1-May 1 and will be considered on a space available basis. Avila University School of Nursing is committed to non-discrimination and equal opportunity in its admission process.

All nursing students must have current certification in BCLS health provider course, an annual TB test, health insurance, and meet immunization and other agency requirements. Drug screening and criminal background checks will be required.

A minimum of 64 semester hours must be completed at a four-year institution. The final thirty (30) hours must be completed at Avila University.

III. LEVEL III — APPLICATIONS AND INTEGRATION (NO TWO-YEAR COLLEGE EQUIVALENT FOR LEVEL III)

Interdisciplinary courses are courses that cross disciplines from any two or more areas of the university and taught at the 310 level or above. They reflect the unique talents and interests of the faculty, use primary sources, address university outcomes and emphasize higher level thinking skills. Students may register for Level III courses only after completing Level I requirements and 15 credit hours of Level II requirements.

Credit/No Credit Policy: No major courses specifically required for the major may be taken CR/NC. No more than 12 hours of the CR/NC grade option are applied toward an Avila University Degree. See Avila University catalog for policy.
