

Kinesiology

Kinesiology is the study of the anatomical, physiological, neurological, and psychosocial aspects of exercise and human movement. The Kinesiology major is a science-based curriculum that provides students with a broad-based knowledge of all sub-disciplines of sports science and prepares the student to assume leadership positions within the health and wellness industry. Kinesiology includes concentrations in Business Administration, Human Behavior, Pre-Physical Therapy, and Sport and Exercise Science.
