## ADVANCED PLACEMENT CREDIT

*Criterion*: Admitted and attending undergraduate students who have completed one or more Advanced Placement courses during high school and took the AP Examinations.

## **Policy Statements:**

- 1. Students must be accepted to the university, enrolled, and attending courses for AP credit to be transcripted.
- 2. AP credit is only granted for undergraduate courses meeting minimum score criteria.
- 3. Students must request that an <u>official</u> copy of the test score(s) be sent to the Avila University Registrar for consideration.
- 4. All AP credits are recorded as credit (CR) grades and <u>do not</u> calculate into the students' grade point average. Students must complete at least 30 hours of credit at Avila University in the completion of a baccalaureate degree.
- 5. A student who has AP credit on another institution's transcript and wants that credit transferred must request that an official copy of the test score(s) be sent to the Avila University Registrar. Credit will be granted for courses with scores meeting the Avila criteria for AP examinations. Credit for AP examinations is recorded after the student registers for coursework at Avila University.
- 6. Credit will be awarded based on the following minimum scores and Avila University course equivalencies.

## *Procedure(s):*

- 1. Students must request that <u>official</u> copies of the test score(s) to the Registrar in the Registration and Student Records Office.
- 2. Once the student has enrolled and attended, the Registrar will review the received scores and send a letter to the student indicating the amount of credit and equivalent courses that will be entered on the student's official transcript. The academic advisor receives a copy of the credit letter.
- 3. The official scores become part of the student's official file located in the Registration and Student Records Office.
