SUBMISSION PROCEDURES

1. The student completes the form and e-mails the form to their faculty mentor.
2. The faculty mentor checks the form, and if the mentor believes the submission is acceptable, endorses the student submission by submitting the application over e-mail.
3. All submissions must be e-mailed to Dr. Jordan Wagge at jordan.wagge@avila.edu by 11:59 p.m. on Friday, February 23rd in order to be considered.
4. The committee will review applications and inform the applicants and mentors of their decision by the end of the day on March 9.
5. All instructions must be followed in order for applications to be considered.
